#### From The Pastors Desk...

A surprise attack by Hamas on Israel and its citizens...thousands killed including children, women, men. Then, Palestinians told to leave everything and migrate south where they were told they would be "safe"...only to be bombed by Israeli planes where they were told to gather.

Violence begets violence.

Soon these kinds of circumstances spiral into more and more complex and deadly issues. And they spiral into more and more difficult issues to resolve and the patterns repeat themselves.

Muslims, Jews, Christians, and people of all faiths claim to worship a God of peace and peacefulness and believe in the universal value of peace as an ultimate goal. Jesus Christ is referred to as "The Prince of Peace" within our Christian traditions and teachings.

But the patterns of violence and acts of destruction are all too visible and grow more and more common.

We are about to enter into the season of Thanksgiving, then quickly shift toward our celebration of the coming of God's only child- the advent of God becoming with us. Our celebrations can divert our attention from the grim and horrible images on our TV screens of death and suffering of others in other places. But even these holy celebrations of the coming months cannot insulate us from reality.

Enthusiastic, genuine commitment and dedication to our faith does not call us to screen out the events of the wider world. Rather we are called to acknowledge those events no matter how unpleasant and brutal. Further we are called to act wherever we can and whenever we can in ways that will reduce and erase violence...and the root causes of violence that seem to infect all cultures and societies.

All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, a new year. Each in their own way call us to fresh, new opportunity and challenges. As we enter this intense and rich, unique season let each of us seek the empowering presence and inspiration of the Holy Spirit that we shall be led to become renewed servants of Him whom we seek to worship not only through our words but through how we behave.




