From The Pastors Desk...

Three nine-year-old students, two adult staff members in their sixties, and another adult started their days in Nashville in the same ways they had for years. Students rode in busses or family cars; the staff members started their responsibilities at the elementary school where they worked, and another adult happened to be subbing at the Covenant school.

The doors of the school were locked to prevent intruders who might have their minds set on any kind of violence. All of the precautions had been taken to make this school a safe place for students, staff, and visitors.

Then the sounds of breaking glass...and gunfire.

A former student who was now in her twenties had a couple of assault weapons and a hand gun. She was determined. The locked glass doors didn't stop her. She was determined to bring chaos and injury and death to the quiet beginning of a routine week of school.

Soon this Easter season at Covenant would become a killing field taking the lives of nine-year-old children, sixty-year-old staff and one substitute teacher. The parents and families of the nine-year-old kids couldn't believe it; they would never see their children alive again. All of the surviving students were led from the school single file by a phalanx of police officers. The children quivered in fear. Some wept as they slowly realized some of their friends were dead.


Staff who had worked together to provide an environment that would be so conducive to growth and healthy development lay in pools of their own blood. They would never see their families again...lives snuffed out.

Soon, police encountered the female shooter. Soon she too would die.

What thoughts and values and concepts of "freedom" come together to cause and allow these kinds of events? Where does our responsibility reside? Are we simply defeated and unable to have any influence whatsoever on situations like this? A Presbyterian elementary school in Tennessee becomes the most recent site that cries out for a response that includes but requires more than simply sending thoughts and prayers.

May we and all people be open to the leading of the Holy Spirit as we search for substantive answers that are different than our past inadequate responses. May God give us strength and determination in this Easter season!



Another scam currently in operation, is the invoice email claiming you owe a bill. That is not how business works so ignore this.


Did you know that seniors are one of the biggest voting blocks in all elections?

Recipe for Seven Layer Salad

- 1. Lettuce (I use romaine because it lasts longer)
- Pepper (Green, Yellow, Red or combination)
 Onion (Can use red or sweet onion)
- 4. Bacon Crumbles
- 5. Frozen Peas
- 6. A dab of Mayonnaise
- 7. A sprinkle of Parmesan Cheese
- 8. 1/4 tsp of sugar (I like to use colored sugar, sometimes)

I put in cups usually clear ones or a container that is air tight. You also use cauliflower broken in bits and carrots. Do not use tomatoes or cucumbers as their shelf life is not long. You can make a batch of these and use for a week.
