From The Pastors Desk...

A writer from Appalachia wrote a sobering note: When one's thinking begins with the congregation and its members rather than with the **Gospel** itself it is likely that ministry and planning and effort will not get beyond the membership of the congregation.

It is so easy for us in our thinking to begin our thinking and to end our thinking about ministry in limited ways. Jesus reminds us clearly that this is an approach that does not please God nor does it follow His teachings.

This pastoral letter will appear in the **August, 2023 NEWSLETTER**. That date reminds us all that we are at the edge of the end of Summer and the resumption of a number of activities and endeavors that have been somewhat on hiatus. This is typical for many churches.

It is easy to become captured by the "activity trap" as we prepare for the resumption of Fall programs and perhaps mounting of some new ministries. The "activity trap" can be so consuming that we become blinded to that thing which Scripture and the Holy Spirit call us to center on and make our top priority: **The Gospel of Jesus Christ.**

Sometimes we can fool ourselves into thinking that doing our activities are as important as authentic efforts to make the **Gospel Message live through how we live our lives.**

Placing the **Gospel at the center of our faith life** isn't usually done casually or just periodically when we have the time. Doing this in authentic ways includes intentionality on our part and a commitment to seek the **leading of the Spirit** as a central part of our daily lives. The **Gospels** become a guide and a resource and most of all, the very center of our individual lives of faith lived with and for our Lord and Savior,,, even **Christ Himself**.

All of the activities we sometimes think are so important absolutely pale by comparison to the centrality and absolute importance of the **Gospels.** This requires Bible study in various forms, of course, but it also requires more. It requires explorations of our faith. **What** do we truly believe? **Why** do we believe it? **Why** do we not believe other things?

As we move through August and prepare more and more for the Fall Season, I pray we can all avoid being captured by the activity trap instead of the Gospel.

And in honest, genuine, authentic, real ways recommit ourselves to the teachings and actions of Christ's Gospel.

Kay served alongside Carol Yeager in the separate and specific Pantry Seniors Program. Kay was the Key Person of this part of the pantry ministry for many years. She served the "Seniors" population that were identified for help and needed to be served in a separate capacity according to government rules. Kay quietly prepared the bags, watched for and greeted her specific clients and served them with the graciousness of a true friend in Christ.

When this program dissolved, Kay stepped into a BIGGER packing job. She and Connie Winslow became Carol Yeager's "packers of food bags". For years, and EVERY Friday of every month, this volunteer dynamic duo, residing on Friday mornings in the Food Pantry Closet, received relayed information of the number of bags needed for registered clients and would immediately pack for families of all sizes. Kay and Connie were determined to correctly pack the number of meals and the assortment of types of food each family was allotted according to family members and government regulations. We could hear them through the walls of the closet as they diligently worked nonstop, packing thousands of bags through the years, with an evident JOY of serving.

When we became a Choice pantry, as required by the Feed Your Neighbor program, Kay switched jobs to become a volunteer assistant to the pantry clients. She became one of the escorts and helpful baggers for each client as food was chosen from all the carts of food groups, as well as the tables of produce, bread and extras.

During this time in the pantry history, there was a lengthy period of months that frozen meat choices at the Foodbanks were almost impossible to order. Realizing that our clients still need a focus on protein for meals, the *Fairgreen funded*, "Meat and Egg Ministry" was begun. To this day, years later, individuals give to both the "Meat and Egg Ministries" as a designated food pantry donation. To start this ministry, it was Kay who contacted Milos Meat Market and arranged the service of ordering individually wrapped, one-pound packages from their Toledo family store monthly. Kay picks up the required, monthly meat order, delivers to church, and often unloads into the freezer so quietly that no one knows she has been there!

In March of 2020, the Pandemic drastically changed the type of pantry delivery we could offer. After closing for two months and reevaluating, we reopened as an afternoon Drive - Thru Pantry in May of 2020. Needing to pack food ahead of time, Kay now joined the scheduled "Thursday Morning Packing Teams" who prepare between 65-100 bags monthly, according to the monthly client need and the calendar Season.

Lastly, Kay has dedicated herself to an often-unseen blessing of recycling the cardboard boxes which monthly overwhelm the pantry. Please see the pictures below to see "Kay at work" breaking down boxes and placing them on carts to load into her car for final delivery to the city recycling sites.

Thank you, Kay, for your continued hours of sacrificial service and servanthood. You are appreciated and loved.
