## From The Pastor Desk....

### WITH MUCH GRATITUDE ...

Toward the end of January the Session met with me for our annual Session Retreat here at Fairgreen. One of the challenges I face when facilitating this kind of gathering is how to open in a way that involves and interests all involved. In the midst of overturning various options without being particularly



thrilled by any ideas, Sheila said to me, "Have the elders say what they are thankful for when it comes to Fairgreen." Then, I had a wonderful idea! I will have the elders say what they are thankful for when it comes to Fairgreen  $\odot$ !

We met in the Commons, and I said that each elder was to voice three things they were thankful for at

Fairgreen—and, they could not repeat what someone else said. I would do two things: 1) I would write down their responses on newsprint, and 2) I would go last so that I had the most challenging position in this exercise in gratefulness. After some visible and subdued groaning we started.

The items were fairly general at first and by the fourth elder up that person had to start digging a bit into their church experience. Various, unique things started to surface that continued to enrich our growing list. I wrote and wrote as my marker squeaked along the gridded paper. Page one, page two, page three, easy. We were part way on page three, and it was my turn at last (literally). I said that I would do three and then do more. I started with my three and continued to write. More discussion effortlessly and spontaneously continued as people practically interrupted each other making sure that more items of gratitude made it on the paper. Page four, page five, page six. We had quite a list! The first forty-five minutes of our time together put the focus where it needed to be: not on my transition, but upon God and God's activity among us in deeply meaningful and life giving ways. Good energy.

Gratitude encourages more gratitude, and the groanings of my initial request to come up with three unique things for which to be thankful got completely lost in a higher and happier discussion and deeper connection.



### **TUESDAY BIBLE STUDY AT EAGLESTONE by Chris Roebuck**

As Michigan members of Fairgreen Church we have been attending Tuesday Bible studies led by Dr. Mike Roadruck, currently at the Eaglestone location for a number of years. Our group is fluid in size but always interesting in content. In our past two years



From the Old Testament, Mike would do much peripheral research and share it with us. We have learned about the twelve tribes of Israel, from whom they were descended, where they settled and why the Levites were the priesthood family of Israel. We also looked in detail at God's instructions for the Tempe and sacrifice.

Moses was such a reluctant leader, perhaps the least likely to lead Israel out of bondage as God's chosen one. We say that repeated many times with God's choices and we say the result of breaking God's law.

In studying the New Testament we realized the significance of the Temple curtain or veil being torn in two at Jesus's crucifixion, the veil of the most Holies, separating the people from God, was destroyed.

To realize that the apostle Mark was the youth who last his garment and ran away naked at Jesus's arrest brought me back to rereading Mark with new eyes.

As we study the letters and journeys of Paul, new revelations come to me. Paul's human side was revealed on his first missionary journey when Barnabas and Paul argues over Mark (Acts 15.36-41) and actually separated because Paul did not want Mark to continue with them. But it is Paul who also preaches that adherence to the law does not make a Christian.

As I read Romans, I did not somehow realize that Paul's missionary journeys covered thirty one years. It was Mike who pointed out that Paul wanted to go to Rome so he could make the case for Christianity to become a recognized religion, an extension perhaps of Judaism. That would have changed history.

There are so many places in the New Testament where the practices and laws of the Old Testament gain meaning, e.g. perfect sacrificial animals/lamb of God.

We would be happy to have you join our group even if you don't live in Michigan, it is an interesting and enlightening experience.

### **CAROL'S CUPBOARD FOOD PANTRY by Linda Hoover**

In January 2019 Joyce Willier from Lutheran Social Services shared the Feed Your Neighbor annual report. The following information emphasizes the need for such a necessary food distribution program addressing hunger in the Toledo area. Fairgreen is designated as Feed Your Neighbor Site 5 and proud to be part of these statistics.

- 1. The nine Feed Your Neighbor sites served 36,209 duplicated individuals. (Clients may visit their zip code pantry once a month.)
- 2. At least 329,661 meals could be created based on what clients selected. These nine pantries are all free choice pantries.
- 3. The nine pantries reported a total of 308 volunteers throughout 2018. These volunteers tallied 21,865 collective hours of service.

Carol's Cupboard continues to be unique in the commitment to offering extras to our clients. Some congregational members give specifically to the weekly additions of eggs, ground beef, and a variety of fresh produce. Thirty dozen eggs are purchased each week. We are extremely grateful to the congregation for generously donating to the Souper Bowl Sunday free will offering. A total of \$188 was collected, and the entire collection was designated to future egg purchases. How wonderful to know the clients will have such a healthy and continuous protein selection.


