

In the Springtime, High Schools often have much anticipated proms. We too, as I see it, have been dancing here at Fairgreen!

It all began in March with the first of three Emerita planning meetings. Joining them on the dance floor were the committee members of Congregational Life and the Worship Planning Team.

The music of voices and ideas was lively, respectful, and energizing! Yes, as in any dance, toes got stepped upon every so often. Yet, perhaps because we were all dancing to the same tune, there were no loud cymbal clashes.

When it was decided to have the Celebration of Life service for Barb Roadruck the day before Pr. Pat Shafer's Emerita presentation, the symphony of planning expanded, and the orchestration stayed amazingly in tune. The dance floor became a place of great cooperation and synchronization.

The back-to-back days of May 20 and May 21 sang songs of sacredness, of sensitivity, of remembrance and of giving thanks.
