<u>Christmas in the Four Gospel Homes</u> is an Advent study written by Cynthia M. Campbell. The Intentional Faith Development Committee of Session will be presenting this study from 10:00am -11:00am on Saturday, November 26, December 3, December 10, and December 17 in the lounge.

There are four weeks of Advent before Christmas. Each of these four weeks we will be looking at one of the four Gospel writers. At the end of the study we will have read and discussed and compared four versions of Christ's birth as to how each writer (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) presents it.

THE LEFT HAND OF GOD

Quite a few years ago, I read a book by Ursula LeGuinn called the Left Hand of Darkness. It was a science fiction book set in the future on a different planet, not a little green men kind of science fiction but a book about gender identity and roles of women in society and government. I was greatly impressed by this book and it has become an honored title in the science fiction world, ranked alongside of Dune. I tried to use the book as a teaching tool with a group of junior high school 'gifted students' but unfortunately, they were not as impressed as I was.

I never really thought about where the title came from until we were doing Bible studies with pastor Mike Roadruck who often referred to The Left Hand of God. The meaning of that was, as he explained, that God did not choose the people we would think were the right people but rather the most unlikely people to accomplish His will. He chose Abraham, an itinerant sheep herder, to be the father of His chosen people, he chose Noah, a drunk, to save the world from the flood, he chose Moses, a recluse who needed his brother Aaron to speak for him to bring His people out of bondage in Egypt, he chose a teenage David to defeat Goliath, he chose a teenage Mary to bring Our Savior, Jesus Christ into the world who then chose a rabid Christian hunter, Paul , to spread His Gospel around the world.

This has continued over the centuries, think St Francis of Assisi who was the son of a wealthy father **or during World War II, Harry Truman**, **a failed** shopkeeper, who became president of the United States then had to make the difficult decision to use atom bombs on Japan and end **the war, then later secure** the future of democracy through difficult negotiations with Stalin and USSR. Today it is a Jewish comedian who is president of Ukraine, a national hero leading them to victory.

God has chosen the left hand approach with societal macrocosms and microcosms. Think Fairgreen Presbyterian Church and its missions over the years, Family Promise, Food Pantry, Building and Grounds maintenance, Christmas Boxes, Angel Tree, Bread Ministry, we can all fill in the names of these leaders.

November is stewardship month here at Fairgreen Presbyterian church. Our Church has not been and is not now just Sunday church, there are many activities in which to participate during the week, just look at our monthly calendar. We need participants for our programs, we need volunteers for our committee. Covid started a period of isolation for some of us. If you are looking for a safe way to get back into social communication, church activities fill that requirement. As pastor Dunifon says, listen for the voice of God and what he is telling you to do, then do it.
