We Thought Two Was Enough

When I was on active duty assigned to an artillery battalion I learned we were one of two in the world with "nuclear capability". That meant that we have "low yield nuclear devices" that we could attach to the tips of our projectiles.

The other battalion with identical capabilities was assigned to Europe. Our contingency assignment was to Southeast Asia.

At that time, following the bombings of Japan that ended World War Two, everyone assumed we would never need more than two units like ours. Surely no sane person would ever consider using nuclear weapons.

A few days ago, Vladimir Putin announced he might send nuclear weapons into Ukraine. Our past assumptions were wrong. The news of Putin's threat is causing many Christians to re-evaluate what we assumed was a given. Nuclear war is too terrible to even consider... we thought.

What is it we Christians can do in the face of these horrible threats? A first step is to reaffirm our faith in the God of unconditional love. This means that we absolutely TRUST the God of our lives to be at work in all circumstances...including threats of nuclear war half a world away. God's gift to us of His only child offers each of us the ASSURANCE that our God will be actively at work in human affairs on behalf of Christ's promises of peace and harmony for ALL of God's children. A promise that includes minimizing and erasing that which is motivated by hate or the terrible cancer that grows from wishing to control other people....or nations.

The sorts of threats that Putin and others make call us to counter the threats with assertions of our faith as we move toward seasonal celebrations in which we can reassert and reconfirm our confidence in God's promises...and it means we are reminded to preach the confidence we have in God and Christ by the WAY we live our lives.

May the way we live our lives be the strong refutation of those who would seek to intimidate or cause doubt in any of our minds or hearts. We ARE people of faith. Let's make all of that crystal clear!



The Lord's Prayer and its Meaning

I have been saying the Lord's prayer ever since I was a little girl growing up in Scotland without really considering what it was that I was asking of God. I chose to settle on the meaning of "Give us this day our daily bread"- did God answer this prayer for me?

Bread has been a diet staple for thousands of years. In the time of Caesar Augustus, ruling over the Romans during the life of Jesus Christ, a daily ration of grain for bread making, oil and wine was given free to every Roman citizen, a Roman welfare system. Bread and circuses, that is how politicians maintained public approval, maybe something that has perhaps continued to the present day.

Going back to the 13th century in medieval Europe, the price of bread was set by a Bread Assize so it was controlled and cheap. It led to the rise of villages and towns. Bread baking became industrialized in the twentieth century. Bread is indispensable to civilization.

My own experience with bread goes back to the time I was growing up in Scotland during World War II. Britain is an island so almost everything was imported, consequently rationed during the war. We could not get bananas, peaches or oranges and sugar, butter and eggs were rationed. Bread was always readily available and cheap so when I told my mother I was hungry she would say "eat bread" which I did. Today I still eat a lot of bread to the detriment of my waistline.

Ultimately, my prayer to the Lord has been answered not only with bread but also with prosperity so I need to keep on praying the Lord's prayer and thanking God for his blessings.

People in need offer these thoughts:

- 1. Numerous people donate Kraft Mac and Cheese in the box. Food pantry guests can rarely use it because Mac and Cheese requires milk and butter which is hard to get from regular food banks.
- 2. Boxed milk is a treasure, as kids need it for cereal. Cereal is always appreciated.
- 3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
- 4. Those in need cannot eat all the awesome canned veggies and soup unless you put a can opener in too or buy pop tops.
- 5. Oil is a luxury but needed for Rice a-Roni which they also is often donated.
- 6. Spices or salt and pepper would be a real Christmas gift.
- 7. Tea bags and coffee make others feel like you care.
- 8. Sugar and flour are treats.
- 9. Hungry people are so excited over fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
- 10. Seeds are cool in Spring and Summer because growing can be easy for some.
- 11. Fresh meat is a blessed commodity.
- 12. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
- 13. Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without the ground beef.
- 14. They get lots of peanut butter but usually not jelly and at many places, not sandwich bread.
- 15. Butter or margarine is nice too.
- 16. Eggs are a real commodity.
- 17. Cake mix and frosting makes it possible to make a child's birthday cake. Remember eggs and oil is often required for the mix.
